Objective

During this one-day workshop, participants will get an overview about objectives and the process approach for Sustainable Urban Mobility Plans (SUMP) and interfaces to National Urban Mobility Policies and Investment Programs (NUMPs). SUMP have been developing as the key strategic tool for city administrations in Europe and around the globe to effectively advance sustainable urban mobility infrastructure and services. Furthermore, national governments engage in establishing policy frameworks and investment programmes for local governments to support SUMP preparation and implementation. A key driver for success is Participation, namely the early engagement of civil society and private sector in the planning process.
